VIEWS FROM THE FRONTLINES

Simply take a drive down Old 92, State Road 60, or 301, and it is painfully obvious that homelessness is on the rise.

In fact, the recent county-wide homeless count revealed that the number of homeless neighbors has risen 24% in the last year.

At our resource centers, we are on the frontlines of this monumental shift. Multiple requests for rental assistance, eviction mitigation, and affordable housing are received daily.

There are additional housing and shelter programs out there, but the system can be beyond difficult to navigate, making the work of ECHO more important than ever before.

WHY MOVE?

Five years ago, we launched our resource center in Riverview.

The original 1500 square foot space allowed us to provide food, clothing, and a with a robust wall of resources.

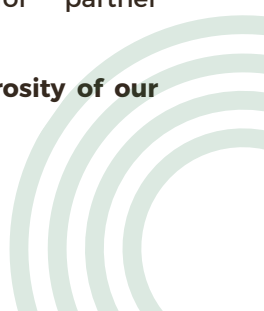
Two years ago, we thought we had hit the jackpot when a second building opened up next door, making way for an onsite advocate and job coach.

But, the demand continued to swell. In five short years, our Riverview Resource center grew from serving 70 families a month to 250 families a month!

Through a robust partnership with the Mosaic company and the generosity of hundreds of individual donors, we moved into an 8,000 square foot building.

Now, ECHO Riverview has the capacity to house two full time advocates, a job coaching team, food, clothing, workshops, community meetings, and satellite offices for partner organizations.

The demand necessitated the move, but the generosity of our community made it possible.

From 1,548 backpacks distributed before the new school year, to 800 hot meals delivered to motel residents, to 441 families receiving gifts and food packages, ECHO loves extending our reach beyond the resource centers.

Beyond our three annual events: Backpack Hero, Thanksgiving Motels, and Gift of Hope, ECHO job coaches are on the road all year round!

Thanks to the generous support of United Way Suncoast, our mobile Back To Work team is connecting with job seekers at local coffee shops, fast food restaurants, and libraries.

63% of Americans are living paycheck to paycheck and senior citizens are the fastest-growing food insecure population in the United States.

Our neighbors, Bill and Nancy, are in their late 70's. They had never had to ask for help; however, with recent cost of living increases and an unexpected medical emergency, they found themselves unable to make ends meet.

Bill and Nancy thought they would get a prepackaged box of food. But they were surprised to be handed a shopping cart and the ability to pick out their own groceries. "Wow, this is so nice!"

The Back-To-Work program at our Brandon and Riverview Resource Centers have made significant strides, increasing its business partner/job database from 289 to 463 local businesses. Through 1006 individual interactions involving 413 unique participants, the program has offered invaluable assistance. This support includes helping 366 participants improve their resumes, enhance interview skills, and refine job search strategies. Notably, 134 individuals, among those who provided feedback, secured employment, and five internships were successfully completed. This achievement was made possible through a Bank of America grant and your support.

MOBILE OUTREACH

Last year, our new mobile Back-To-Work initiative expanded our community engagement, reaching 145 neighbors. Of these, 45 utilized our back-to-work services, with 22 successfully finding employment.
